FALL LEAF PICKUP SCHEDULE ANNOUNCED

Leaf pickup will take place each week on **Mondays** and **Tuesdays** beginning October 6th and 7th and run through December 1st and 2nd.

Reminders are as follows:

Leaves **must be** bagged in biodegradable leaf bags and placed curbside by 7:00 AM of the day of pickup.

No alley pickups except in Holliday Hills.

Twigs, 3 inches and less in diameter, **must be bundled**

and tied. (No wire.)

Pickup to the **EAST** of Penn Street, including the east side of Penn Street, in the Borough will be **on Mondays**.

Leaf pickup to the **WEST** of Penn Street, Gaysport, and Holliday Hills, in the Borough will be **on Tuesdays**.

There is no need to call to schedule pickup. Bags that contain recyclables or bags that are taped or stapled **will not be picked up** (simply


fold the top of the bag over).

If items are missed, the pickup will occur the **next week**.

BE ON THE LOOKOUT FOR LEAKS!



As you can see from the chart below it does not take much of a leak to use a lot of water.

A dripping faucet, a toilet running periodically, a garden hose that does not shut off completely are just a few items that can cause your water and sewer bills to increase.

If you think that you may have a leak, please contact the Water Department at 696-0623 to schedule an appointment for one of the Public Works Employees to come and check your home for any leaks.

IT IS PENNSYLVANIA'S LAW.....



The Borough takes tremendous pride in the fact that its residents are consistently doing projects to take care of and maintain their homes. It is one of the great attributes of Hollidaysburg.

Be mindful that Pennsylvania State Law requires that you must obtain appropriate permits to have certain types of projects done. Not obtaining the necessary permits could lead to legal ac-

tion and fines. Zoning permits from the Borough may also be necessary. Be sure to make the phone call before your project begins to ensure that the project progresses in a timely manner and that you will not find yourself faced with penalties.

HOW TO AVOID SEWER PROBLEMS...

The two most common causes of sewer backups are:

- * Putting items down your sink that should be put into your garbage.
- * Invasive tree roots.

That's the bad news. The good news is that both are often preventable. Here's what you can do to help avoid problems in your sewer system:

Don't put grease, oil or egg shells down your sink. When grease and egg shells combine they create a mixture similar to concrete; oil sticks to the pipe at the waterline. Both of these conditions can clog the sewer line. Instead, keep a small, empty container handy to

contain these items. When the container is full, put it outside with the garbage.

Avoid trees with shallow, spreading root systems. Tree roots tend to grow towards sources of water like sewer pipes. Two of the most troublesome species of trees are the Fruitless Mulberry and the Modesto Ash. If you're upgrading your home's landscaping, you can save yourself headaches and money by choosing trees with deep root systems.

After you select a tree, follow proper planting procedures. Be sure to dig a hole deep enough. If your

hole is too shallow, the tree's roots won't be able to penetrate the clay, and they'll spread out horizontally. The tree won't be healthy... and neither will your sewer system.

Speaking of things you shouldn't put down your sink...

Many consumer products are considered household hazardous waste. Never pour items like these into your sink or toilet:

Motor Oil, Weedkiller, Antifreeze, Solvents, Gasoline, Wood Preservatives, Paint, Lighter Fluid and Insecticides

CARDBOARD COLLECTED AT ROADSIDE Corrugated cardboard boxes and paperboard boxes (ex. cereal boxes) have been added to the curbside collection. You may recycle these by flattening bundled boxes or nesting flattened boxes together in cardboard box. These should be set out for collection at the curbside with your paper recycling.



THE COMPOST FACILITY IS MAINTAINING OPERATIONS The compost facility located on Blacksnake Road is now under the management of the IRC. Accepted items are: leaves, grass and brush, electronics, and other recyclables.

R&D COMPOST FACILITY The R&D Compost Facility located in Duncansville will be open Tuesdays until Thanksgiving from 12 PM-5 PM.

Screened Compost or Screened Mulch will be available for purchase between the hours of 3 PM – 5 PM. No electronics accepted. *There are recycling drop-off containers below the composting pad that residents may use to recycle bottles and cans, paper, and cardboard. Glass, bottles, and jars may be recycled inside the garage at the top of the composting pad. Please do not leave glass containers by the drop-offs.*
