### DISCOVERY GARDEN

Gardening enthusiasts are invited to attend a series of gardening classes held in cooperation with Hollidaysburg Borough and Penn State Extension. Tom Ford, Area Commercial Horticulture Educator with Penn State Extension, Cambria County teaches the classes.

The series of classes are free and open to the public. In return, participants agree to volunteer 18 hours at the Discovery Garden in Legion Park throughout the growing season from May to October 2015. Participants will receive a certificate of completion after the classes are over. Volunteers agree to work a minimum of two to three hours a week during the gardening season. Volunteer assignments include spring cleanup, planting, weeding, deadheading, guiding garden tours and helping with special events. Other opportunities are available for volunteers interested in providing educational activities for individuals participating in the horticultural therapy program of Skills and other community groups.

Class topics will include: Session I: Plant Health Care Begins with Soil Quality: Ford will discuss how gardeners can improve soil fertility through the use of cover crop, compost, and organic fertilizers. Session II: Plant Health Care Starts with Plant Selection, Planting, and Maintenance: Ford will discuss how to expertly select, plant, and maintain landscape plants. Session III: Plant Health Care: Using Integrated Pest Management (IPM) Techniques in Landscape Settings: Ford will discuss how to apply IPM practices/techniques in your garden & landscape. Session IV: Plant Health Care: Application of Horticultural Best Management Practices in Landscape Settings : Ford will demonstrate how gardeners can employ best management practices through hands-on activities at the Discovery Garden in Hollidaysburg.

The Discovery Garden is a project of the Skills Foundation, which provides programs and supports to people with intellectual disabilities and mental illness. One of the Skills Foundation's programs is the Horticultural Therapy program at Discovery Garden. The program provides opportunities for people with intellectual disabilities to be involved in their community while experiencing the benefits of horticultural therapy such as exercise, socialization, improving gross and motor skills and lessening anxiety.

### SNOW SHOVELING

With the continuing winter weather, please be considerate of your neighbors and remember to shovel sidewalks **within 24 hours** of the end of a snowfall event.

The buildup of snow and ice on sidewalks can be dangerous for pedestrians of any age, and Borough Ordinance requires residents to maintain a **30 inch pathway free of snow.** 

The Borough appreciates your cooperation with keeping the sidewalks safe by complying with the Borough's Ordinance!

### WINTER WEATHER PROCEDURES

In the event of a heavy snowfall, Mayor Stultz will make a snow emergency declaration to begin at either 8:00 AM or at 8:00 PM.

The Borough will institute the **odd-even** parking designation during snow emergencies and ONLY during those times.

If the snow emergency begins at **8:00 PM** (in the *EVENing,*) vehicles must be parked on the **EVEN**-numbered side of the street; if at **8:00 AM** (<u>morning</u>), cars must be moved to the **odd-numbered** side of the street.

The objective is to achieve bare pavement on all Borough streets within 36 hours after a snowfall has ended. Snow emergencies will be announced on local media and on <u>www.hollidaysburgpa.org</u>.

Please remember that **ANY** vehicle that violates the parking regulations imposed by a snow emergency <u>WILL BE TOWED</u> <u>AT OWNER'S EXPENSE.</u>

Remember, odd-even parking restrictions are only in effect when a Snow Emergency has been declared!

According to Borough Ordinance, **all property and business owners** must clear all sidewalks of snow within **24 hours** of the end of a snow event!



### **SLEDDING REMINDERS**

To accommodate the popular wintertime activity of sledding, during times of significant snowfall, Spruce Street will be closed between Bella & Bell Streets ( the "double dips") to allow for sledding between 8:00 AM and 10:00 PM. There should be no sledding after 10:00 PM. Remember that the street will **only be closed** when there is a significant snowfall, not every day in the winter.

Parents, please remind children of this precaution!



#### Free IRC My-Waste App

In an effort to make recycling easier for everyone, the IRC has worked with My-Waste to develop a smart phone app for our area. Exciting features for residents include: the ability to report a missed collection, sign-up for alerts, set a personal recycling calendar, and search for nearby dropoffs. You may use this feature on your desktop or download the mobile app to your smart phone device.

You can find the app on our website, Google Play, or iTunes.

#### **R&D** Compost Facility The

R&D Compost Facility located in Duncansville will remain open through spring. The facility will be open Tuesdays from 12 PM - 5 PM. Screened Compost or Screened Mulch will be available for purchase between the hours of 3 PM and 5 PM. No electronics accepted.

<u>Recycling Bins</u> If you still need a recycling bin, you can pick them up at the IRC office, IRC municipal buildings or highway yards. The residential bin distribution event held the end of October was a rousing success but some residents missed the event.

- Hollidaysburg Municipal Building (401 Blair Street)
- IRC Office at Altoona City Hall (1301 – 12<sup>th</sup> Street, Suite 8 in the basement)
- Altoona Highway Yard (5010 Sixth Avenue at Commerce Park)
- Logan Township Municipal Building (100 Chief Logan Circle just off 26<sup>th</sup> Street and Pleasant Valley Boulevard)

Residents should ideally have a bin with a lid for paper recycling and an open bin for bottles and cans. If you have an old damaged bin or a county bin (that says "Blair County Recycles") and wish to trade it in for a bin that can take a lid, please bring in the bin for a trade-in. Very large households may qualify for a 25 gallon round container.

Lids are limited to one per household for paper recycling. Wheel kits are available for purchase at the IRC office to all residents for \$2.00 while supplies last. If you have questions please call 942 -7472 or email kpope@ircenvironment.org.

## A NOTE FROM THE CHIEF

#### SPRING BRUSH PICKUP IN THE BOROUGH TO BEGIN IN APRIL

The Borough will begin Spring Brush Pickup this year in **April**. Pickup will begin on **Monday**, **April 6**, **2015** and continue <u>EACH WEEK</u> through **Tuesday**, **May 19**, **2015**.

Throughout that time, Borough workers will pick up and haul away compostable waste such as: dead leaves, dead plant material, tree and brush trimmings and branches up to 3" in diameter and 6' in length. Brush and branches must be bundled with string or twine. Please do not use wire to bundle. Items that will not be picked up are: stone, garbage, gravel, dirt, junk, and appliances.

Borough crews will pick up all brush and bags on the <u>East side of Penn</u> <u>Street every Monday and items will</u> be picked up on the <u>West side of Penn</u> <u>Street every Tuesday.</u>

If your items were not set out in time or they were missed, they will be picked up the **FOLLOWING WEEK.** Items must be placed curbside by 7:00AM, and the only alley pickups will be **Sweet Cherry Court** in Holliday Hills.

For the rest of the summer, the pickups will take place on the **MONDAYS AND TUESDAYS OFTHE SECOND AND THE FOURTH WEEK OF EACH MONTH.**
