## SPRING BRUSH PICKUP TO BEGIN

The Borough will begin brush pickup this year in **April**.

Pickup will begin on **Monday, April 4, 2016** and continue **EACH WEEK** through **Tuesday, May 24, 2016**.

Throughout that time, Borough workers will pick up and haul away compostable waste such as:

- Dead Leaves
- Dead Plant Material
- Tree & Brush Trimmings
- Branches - up to 3" in diameter & 6' in length.

**Brush and branches must be bundled with string or twine. Please do not use wire to bundle.**

Items that will **NOT** be picked up are:

- Stone
- Gravel
- Junk
- Garbage
- Dirt
- Appliances



Borough crews will pick up all brush and bags on the **East** side of **Penn Street** every **Monday** and items will be picked up on the **West** side of **Penn Street** every **Tuesday**.

If your items were not set out in time or they were missed, they will be picked up the **FOLLOWING WEEK**. Items must be placed curbside by 7AM, and the only alley pickups will be **Sweet Cherry Court** in Holliday Hills.

You can also drop your items at the **IRC Duncansville Recycling & Compost Facility**. It is open **Tuesdays only – 12PM – 5PM**.

Please see directions at the bottom of the page.

For the rest of the **summer** the pickups will take place on the **Mondays and Tuesdays of the 2nd & 4th week** of each month.

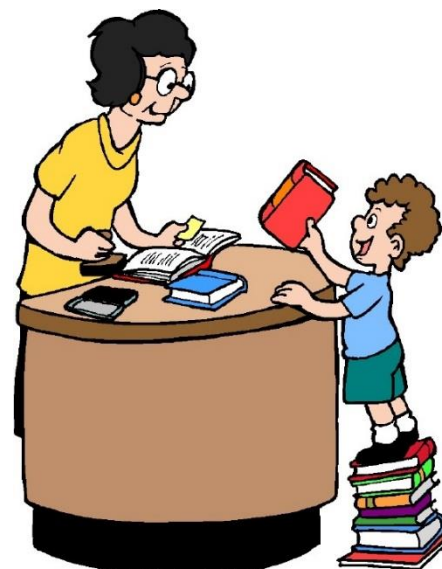

## SEWER REPLACEMENT PROJECT UPDATE

As you might be aware, the Hollidaysburg Sewer Authority (HSA) has undertaken a massive sewer line replacement project. This project was mandated by the PA Dept of Environmental Protection. The project includes replacement of approximately 34,000 feet of mainline sewer in two sub basins within the Hollidaysburg sewer collection system. The HSA received a loan and grant combination from PennVest that will fund the full cost of the project. It is anticipated that a further user rate increase will not be necessary to offset the cost of this project. All residents in the affected areas have received letters describing the project and their responsibility once the project is completed. If you have "not" received a letter from HSA, your residence will not be affected by this project. The project includes the complete replacement of the main sewer lines in the affected

areas. This portion of the project is tentatively scheduled to commence July 2016 and be completed by July 2017. The second part of the project requires that all affected homeowners pass a pressure test on their sewer service lateral (at homeowner's expense) including under slab. If the line does not pass the test, the owner will be required to repair or replace their service lateral at their own expense. Every household is required to be connected to the new sewer system by late 2018. The HSA apologizes in advance for any inconvenience that this project make cause our customers. This project is necessary for HSA to continue to provide the best and most reliable sewer service to our residents and stay committed to the protection of our environment. ## A NOTE FROM THE CHIEF

Chief Gehret wants to remind everyone to beware of the "IRS Scam."

The IRS Scam involves someone posing as an "IRS Agent" calling or emailing about back taxes. Threats of penalties and jail time will be made which are then followed

up with the option to send cash for the back taxes.

If a call like this is received, take the following steps:

- Assume it's a scam. If you have back taxes, a letter will be received and not a phone call.
- Hang up immediately offering no information.
- Report the incident to the U.S. Treasury inspector general for tax administration at 800-366-4484.

## HOLLIDAYSBURG BOROUGH SEWER CALL RESPONSE POLICY REMINDER

The Hollidaysburg Sewer Authority at its September 13, 2010 meeting adopted a change in the sewer call response policy. The following policy is in effect:

1) The Borough will respond to all sewer backup calls in a timely manner. If you have a sewer problem/backup at your residence, please call the Borough office at 814-695-7543 to report your problem. If it is afterhours please call 695-7543 and you will be prompted to leave a message for the oncall supervisor who will return your call promptly! A borough staff member will respond to all calls no matter what time of day or night.

2) If there is a sewer clean out at the property line and it can be determined who is responsible for the blockage, either

the borough crew or a homeowner hired plumber will unclog the blockage.

3) If there is no clean out at the property line and the Hollidaysburg sewer main is clear, it is the responsibility of the homeowner to unclog all blockages on the service lateral. This will remain the case until the homeowner installs a clean out at the property line.

4) The Borough will in No Instance enter into any residents home to access the plumbing to unclog a sewer backup.

## FUNDING AVAILABLE FOR SEWER LATERAL REPLACEMENT



The Hollidaysburg Sewer Authority wants our customers to be aware that there is a source of funding available to our customers that might not be able to pay up front for their sewer lateral replacement.

Water/Sewer unsecured loan (\$2,000-10,000), up to 60 months, 4.99%, are available to our residents for the purpose of assisting homeowners mandated by municipal authorities to upgrade/replace water or sewer lines.

Disbursement will be made directly to the service provider (bid or invoice required), and majority of funds must be made payable to service provider. Minimal amounts may

be disbursed directly to borrower to assist with other project needs (landscaping, sidewalk repair, etc.).

## PA WALKWORKS



Hollidaysburg Borough has joined the Pennsylvania WalkWorks Program to be a part of the efforts to increase physical activity in the area. PA WalkWorks is a grant funded program that encourages sustainable physical activity through the built environment, social supports, and healthy lifestyle behaviors.

Two walking routes have been created in the borough. Walking route A, also known as the Historic Hollidaysburg Route, is a counterclockwise loop and is 1.63 miles in length. It begins and ends on Allegheny Street. Walking route B, the Gaysport Route, is two counterclockwise loops and is 1.11 miles in length. This route begins and ends in the Canal Basin parking lot. Maps for the routes are available on the Facebook page for WalkWorks Routes in Hollidaysburg.

Kick off day for the program is April 22nd at noon at the Blair County Courthouse! Because this a grant funded program, everyone walking either of the routes is asked to sign up. ## SIGNS IN PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAYS

Please keep in mind! According to the Hollidaysburg Borough Ordinance – Chapter 27, Part 5, Section 507.3B, **no signs** are to be placed in the public right-of-way with the exception of a select few.

Those exceptions include government postings, bus stop signs, information regarding public utilities, and emergency warnings.

Any signs such as yard sale advertisements erected in the public right-of-way are forfeited to the public and subject to confiscation.



## IT IS PENNSYLVANIA LAW!

The Borough takes tremendous pride in the fact that its residents are consistently doing projects to take care of and maintain their homes. It is one of the great attributes of Hollidaysburg.

Be mindful that Pennsylvania State Law requires that you must obtain appropriate permits to

have certain types of projects done. Not obtaining the necessary permits could lead to legal action and fines. Zoning permits from the Borough may also be necessary. Be sure to make the phone call before your project begins to ensure that the project progresses in a timely

manner and that you will not find yourself faced with penalties.

On May 27th, 2016 – the Borough will host a **Cruise-In Event** in Downtown Hollidaysburg.

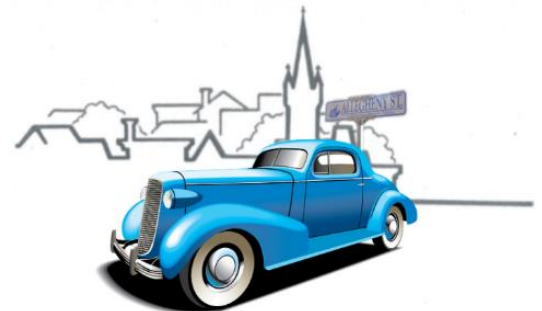
