# SPRING & SUMMER BRUSH PICKUP

The Borough will begin brush pickup this year in **April**. Pickup will begin on **Monday, April 7, 2014** and continue **EACH WEEK** through **Tuesday, May 20, 2014**.

Throughout that time, Borough workers will pick up and haul away compostable waste such as:

- Dead Leaves
- Dead Plant Material
- Tree & Brush Trimmings
- Branches up to 3" in diameter & 6' in length.

Brush and branches must be bundled with string or twine. Please do not use wire to bundle.

Items that will **NOT** be picked up are:

- Stone
- Garbage
- Gravel
- Dirt
- Junk
- Appliances

Borough crews will pick up all brush and bags on the East side of Penn Street every Monday and items will be picked up on the West side of Penn Street every Tuesday.

If your items were not set out in time or they were missed,

they will be picked up the **FOLLOWING WEEK.** Items must be placed curbside by 7AM, and the only alley pickups will be **Sweet Cherry Court** in Holliday Hills.

You can also drop your items at the IRC Duncansville Recycling & Compost Facility. It is open April thru November - Tuesdays only - 12pm - 5pm. Please see directions below.

For the rest of the summer the pickups will take place on the Mondays and Tuesdays of the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> week of each month.

Recycling Bins If you still need a recycling bin, you can pick them up at the IRC office, IRC municipal buildings or highway yards. The residential bin distribution event held the end of October was a rousing success but some residents missed the event.

- Hollidaysburg Municipal Building (401 Blair Street)
- IRC Office at Altoona City Hall (1301 – 12<sup>th</sup> Street, Suite 8 in the basement)
- Altoona Highway Yard (5010 Sixth Avenue at Commerce Park)
- Logan Township Municipal Building (100 Chief Logan Circle just off 26<sup>th</sup> Street and Pleasant Valley Boulevard)

Residents should ideally have a bin with a lid for paper recycling and an open bin for bottles and cans. If you have an old damaged bin or a county bin (that says "Blair County Recycles") and wish to trade it in for a bin that can take a lid, please bring in the bin for a trade-in. Very large households may qualify for a 25 gallon round container.

Lids are limited to one per household for paper recycling. Wheel kits are available for purchase at the IRC office to all residents for \$2.00 while supplies last. If you have questions please call 942-7472 or email kpope@ircenvironment.org.


# **ALLEGHENY STREET CRUISE-IN & SIDEWALK SALE**


